We are working on assessing your child's reading and thinking skills with the STAR and Fountas & Pinnell Reading Tests during the next few weeks. Please make sure you are reading with, to and by your child. Ask him or her to retell stories, make predictions and tell the most important parts.

It's helpful if your child gets a good night's rest (students in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade should be sleeping 10 - 11 hours a night), eats breakfast and is on time to school. Also, check your child's Wednesday folder for behavior updates and important notes from school.
